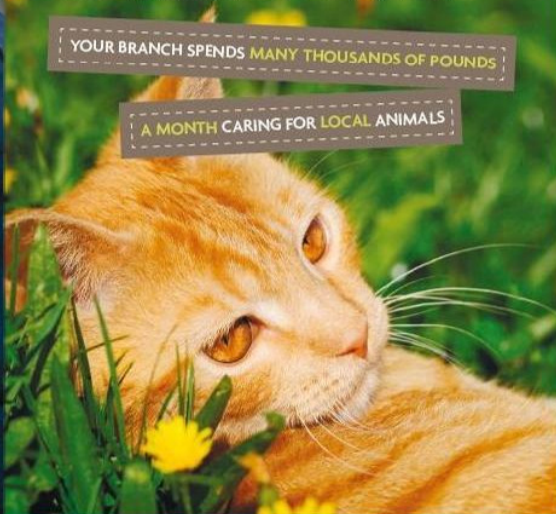
Local animals need your help

Here are two cases that your local branch, RSPCA South, East & West Devon, have helped:

Indy ♥

Indy was hit by a passing car and fled the scene. It took an Inspector and the local Dog Warden to catch her and take her to the vets. She spent a week there, where she had her left front leg amputated. She was traumatised by her experience and spent two months at the Shelter recovering and adapting to life on three legs. She has since found a special family of her own and now has two doggy friends to play with.



Derek ♥

Derek came to the Shelter via an Inspector. He had been found hanging around some builders who were working on a house in Paignton. He was very thin and hungry. Once in our care, it became clear there was some other issue with him as he wasn't eating properly. He was diagnosed with hyperthyroidism. This is an operable condition in cats. However, due to the fact that Derek was very underweight and we weren't sure how old he was (10+ was the conservative estimate) we decided operating may be too risky. It turned out he was quite happy to take tablets if they were in a tasty treat. He has come on leaps and bounds and now has a new home and garden which he shares with other cats.



Leave a legacy

If you are making a will, please remember that the RSPCA South, East & West Devon Branch and all the other RSPCA branches are separately registered charities. I give the sum of £..... (or specify a share of residue) to the RSPCA South, East & West Devon Branch, Registered Charity Number 205154, RSPCA South, East & West Devon Branch, Little Valley Animal Shelter, Black Hat Lane, Exeter EX2 9TA for its general purposes and I declare that the receipt of the Honorary Treasurer or other proper officer of the said RSPCA for the time being shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the said legacy.

Please note that a Will or Codicil needs to be properly witnessed, and you should obtain legal advice.

Gifts to registered charities are generally exempt from Inheritance and Capital Gains Tax, so a gift to the RSPCA South, East & West Devon Branch would therefore greatly benefit local animals with minimum burden to your estate.
